Profile of the College

Higher and Higher, in Education

Kanyakumari district, known for its extremely high rate of literacy traditionally, has a few shadow regions geographically that are physically devoid of institutions of higher education. To cover the disadvantage population of one such coastline, St John's College of Arts and Science was started in 2009 at A mmandivilai as a Christian M inority educational institution.

When the college started enrolling students, it was a dream come true not only for the poor families that were till them compelled to send their children to distant places in the districts for college education but also for the two visionary founders, Rev. Fr. Dr. V. John Bosco and Rev. Fr. A. Albin Roby, who first felt the need for the college in and around Ammandivilai in 2002.

The founders have been, for the past 15 years, the trustees of the JVDC Trust, which was launched to promote higher education among the less fortunate youth of the coastal belt. The project is sponsored by Rev. Fr. Jan Vriend from the Netherlands, who has an ecclesiastical and ecumenical philanthropy to help the poor and the downtrodden. The founders and the patron, Rev. Fr. Jan Vriend, firmly believed that education was the only means of liberating the rural and poor youth socially and economically. By providing them easy access to higher education, they could be put on the path of development and social emancipation, they felt.

So Rev Fr. Dr. V. John Bosco and Rev. Fr. A. Albin Roby initiated consultations and discussions, in 2002, to give shape to their dream, which kept them and many other experts engaged for a couple of years. In February 2005, Fr. Jan Vriend and his pastoral team successfully finalized the modus operandi for the execution of the project.

So, with a missionary zeal, all of them fully committed themselves to the service of providing the best education for children of less fortunate families and founded the college based on Christian values of faith, hope and love. Most Rev. Dr. Peter Remigius, the Bishop of Kottar, gave his blessings by laying the corner stone of the college. The former Bishop of Kottar, Late Most Rev. Dr. Leon Dharmaraj, had been a source of great moral support since the inception of the idea.

The Government of Tamil Nadu crowned the efforts of the patron and the founders by granting its permission through the G.O.M.S. No. 54 dated 04.02.2009. The M.S. University, Tirunelveli, also granted affiliation to the College to function from the academic year 2009-2010 with B.Sc (Computer Science), BBA, B.Com and BA (English).

In 2010-2011, BCA and B.Sc (Mathematics) were added as courses of study. In the academic year 2012-2013 the College was given permission to begin PG courses in M.A (English), M.Com and M.Sc (Computer Science) and in 2013-2014 the college was allowed to offer M.Sc (Mathematics) course. In 2016-2017, the institution reached a higher level when it was permitted to start M.Phil programme in English and Mathematics. The college will add one more feather to its academics cap in 2018-19 by offering a new course – B.Sc (Physics)

The college that has grown tremendously in the past one decade aspires to reach higher levels of excellence in education without deviating from the Christian values, on which its foundation has been laid.

In the academic Year 2020 - 2021, the University had given the permission to start the research Centre in Commerce. In 2022 - 2023, the University permitted to bring the research centre in English.

- Obtain a minimum of 60% marks in every test conducted in the class.

REGULATIONS

- Write the retest when held, if you are absent due to valid reasons or had not obtained 60% marks.
- Be neatly dressed and clean-shaven at all times in the College premises.
- Do not violate the dress code or fail to wear identity card while in the campus. Always be in possession of your identity card for verification.
- Do not smear colored powder or water during any festival, function or any other occasion in the College campus.

- Short Salwars, Cholis, Jeans, Shorts, Mini-Skirts and T-Shirts are not allowed at any time.
- Students are not allowed to bleach their hair.

NOTE All students are instructed to adhere strictly to the Dress Code. Students must note that violation of the regulations stated above will entail severe punishment. Possessing and using Cell Phones and other Electronic items like Cameras, Walkmans and Radios are strictly prohibited in the College.

RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED INSIDE AND OUTSIDE THE CAMPUS

Ragging is a crime in the eyes of Law. It is a cognizable offence. The Government of Tamilnadu has banned ragging in educational institutions vide its order No.7 dated 14/12/1997 which makes ragging punishable as follows: *Imprisonment upto a term of two years, a fine upto Rs. 10,000/- and dismissal from the institution*. The student so dismissed shall not be admitted to any other educational institution. Students are warned not to commit any act that could be construed as ragging. They are also exhorted to rise up against this evil.

Class Attendance

Students are strongly advised not to miss any lectures, without proper reason. Seventy five percent attendances is compulsory. Those who get less than 75% attendance will not be eligible to appear for the semester examinations.

Leave

Application for leave should be submitted to the head of the department through the class advisor at least two days in advance. In case of emergency parents should contact the College office and inform the leave availed. Students who attend any programme officially should apply through their head of the department.

Games

Students should benefit themselves of all the sports and games facilities in the campus between 3.15 and 5.00 in the evening. Students who are involved in the College sports and games events are advised to take care of their studies and achieve excellence also.

Mentor System

For the effective monitoring of the welfare of the students, 20 students will be under the guidance of a faculty member called mentor, for a period of one year. The mentors will guide their wards to grow in academic excellence and shine in co-curricular activities.

The mentors shall keep the record of wards under their care and periodically inform them about the disciplinary proceedings against their wards in case of the latter's violation of the code of conduct or misbehavior in the class. They shall counsel the students and interact with their parents whenever they visit the College. The mentors shall also be responsible for the overall development of their wards' personality and help them to become better individuals.

(Library)

- The library functions on all working days from 9.a.m to 4.p.m
- Members must scan their identity card (ID) when they enter and exit.
- Members are not permitted to exchange their identity cards.
- Strict silence should be maintained in the library.
- No personal belongings allowed inside the library (printed matter or files).
- Reference books, journals, magazines, newspapers, CD ROM and other reference documents will not be lent out.
- Reading materials should not be removed from its place without the knowledge of the librarian.
- Books will be issued or renewed only if the student provides their library cards.
- Library will issue two tickets for UG students, three tickets for PG, M.Phil and Ph.D scholars, five tickets for teaching and two tickets for non-teaching staff members.
- ✤ A member can borrow one book for each ticket.
- UG student is allowed to keep a book for seven days, PG, M.Phil and Ph.D scholars for fifteen days, faculty members for a month from the date of issue.
- Borrowers must examine each book before borrowing and immediately report any damaged/missing pages to the librarian.

- Borrowers are responsible for a loss or damage of the books borrowed. Every book will be examined when it is returned and if any book is found to be marked. Soiled or damaged, the borrower will be required to replace the book with a new copy or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the principal.
- All tickets must be returned to the library when a member leaves the college.
- Members who leave the college in the middle of a term for any reason must return all books and tickets before they depart.

E-Learning Centre

- Computers in the library premises should be used for academic purpose only.
- Online chatting and playing games browsing of social networking sites is strictly prohibited.
- Altering any computer settings or displays in the e-learning centre is not allowed.
- Users should not remove/unplug computer cable/connections, network cables and other peripherals in the e-learning centre.
